#### Questions

### Start

How long have you been involved with arts & culture in your community and why do you feel it's important to support? Ex) Placemaking, economic diversity, cultural identity, etc.



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I've been involved in the arts and culture here in Airdrie for 7 years, almost as soon as I began to act in Airdrie. I think culture (and arts as an offshoot of that) is paramount to growing a healthy and thriving community. Not only can it assist with economic growth (arts bringing non-residents to spend their money in Airdrie can alleviate the dollars residents put into their city), but it helps to bring the community together. Whether people sit in the audience of a play, or view paintings at a gallery, or jam with musicians (as well as other artistic forms), they are coming together as community. They are experiencing something with each other and are contributing to the collective experience of art. Not only that, but I know from personal experience, that engaging in art is what engaged me in the community. I volunteer with other groups, but it was through art, through the theatre that brought me down that path. I discovered my people, my place in the world through the theatre.

## Enhancement

How do you feel (or can you give examples) of how you've personally enhanced arts & culture in your community? Ex) Volunteering, mentoring, advocating, etc.

I've been instrumental in growing the footprint of theatre arts in Airdrie. I was president of Nose Creek Players for three years (2011-2014), during which time we performed at Bert Church Live Theatre, outside in parks, for corporate parties, for businesses during their own special events, etc. As a group, we volunteered for different causes, all with the underlying understanding that arts build community. I work and volunteer with Torchlight Theatre, I sit on the Airdrie Film Society Board as Secretary, and I'm constantly speaking to the need for arts support and engagement. For 4 or 5 years, I've tried (and been successful for the most part) to bring all the arts disciplines together, to break down the silos that we find ourselves in, in order to create a collective front when presenting ourselves to the community. I work with children and youth, for they are the next generation to take up the flame of advocacy and encourage them to find their voice, and to follow the passion/craft. This year, I was instrumental in arranging an arts political forum to allow for artists to speak to the municipal candidates, again to raise awareness, and to ensure candidates are aware of the issues we find in our disciplines.

## Sphere of Influence

I am past president of Nose Creek Players (2011-2014), I am on the board of Airdrie Film Society (2017-) as Secretary, I volunteer with Kulture Shake to review various performances to create buzz, as well as the work I do with the Bert Church Live Theatre, and Torchlight Theatre as an instructor and volunteer (Torchlight Theatre's mainstage shows). Nose Creek Players is a community theatre group that in my tenure worked to promote original work, thus giving local playwrights an opportunity to have their work produced. Also during my tenure, the Airdrie Original One Act Play Festival was formed. Playwrights produced their shows and were adjudicated. Airdrie Film Society is in its first year and as a first event, we are holding an Airdrie Film Festival, where local and national filmmakers submitted their films for screening. The majority of films are local/Albertan. The mandate of the AFS is to create opportunities for local filmmakers, and to also host workshops so those filmmakers can grow in their craft.
