She works as a graphic designer, helping other companies with their rebranding and marketing messages. In addition to this demanding job, she paints and fabricates stunning pieces of art that are unlike anything we've ever seen before. Intensely passionate about her craft and the artistic community she is like the shield maiden of Arts & Culture for Airdrie. Lia was one of the primary contributors in the rebranding of ARTember last year (Airdrie's month long, city wide celebration of arts & culture). I officially graduated from the Alberta College of Art and Design in 2001 and have worked professionally since then but I was involved in the Arts previously, having worked as an Arts Instructor for the Kelowna Art Gallery and volunteering in many other creative capacities. I was always interested in the aesthetic of Art, but my time at The Kelowna Art Gallery forever changed the trajectory of my life. I saw the transformative power of Art, the sense of community and conversation that is built through a participation in the arts, no matter the medium. They bring to focus our shared human condition.

I have volunteered locally for Arts organizations such as Creative Airdrie and The Arts Society. I regularly enroll in courses/workshops at the Alberta College of Art and Design, and recently had a sculptural hat piece chosen to show in their Spotlight: Continuing Education exhibit.
